Muskeg Lake Cree Nation Drug Strategy

MLCN Chief and Council, along with the MLCN Elders have implemented a drug strategy which is in the best interest of our youth, our elders and our community. This drug strategy is directed to any person who resides in Muskeg Lake Cree Nation and occupies MLCN Housing. For any person who lives in MLCN and is suspected of selling illegal or prescription drugs, the RCMP will be contacted. Once the RCMP receives the complaint, they will do their investigation. If that said person gets convicted of selling illegal or prescription drugs, they will be evicted from their unit immediately, as stated in the Muskeg Lake Cree Nation Housing Policy drafted November 20, 2014.

It states in section 8.3 Just Cause for Eviction “e) cases within the dwelling of unlawful activity or other activities which interfere with the peace and quiet of occupants of neighboring housing units”.

This includes if someone is staying with you and they get convicted of this offence. As the designated occupant of your unit, you will be held responsible for them and will be evicted.


